The IEA's World Energy Outlook recognizes natural gas' critical role

Is natural gas affordable? Is it secure? Is it clean?

The International Energy Agency's World Energy Outlook asserts that prospects for natural gas will be determined by how policymakers and prospective consumers answer those three questions-and it concludes that the answers should and will be in the affirmative.

Growth projections for natural gas as affordable, sustainable and complementary to renewable energy make it an important player in the global energy mix, the report states. Global gas consumption is expected to grow at an average rate of 1.6 percent annually until 2040, which represents a higher growth projection than either oil or coal. In fact, natural gas is expected to account for a quarter of global energy demand by 2040.

The International Gas Union applauds the agency for a report that recognizes the critical importance of natural gas in the global energy mix, both as a sustainable and affordable option and one that complements the use of renewable energies.

"This year's World Energy Outlook is extremely positive for the natural gas industry-highlighting the absolutely essential role we have to play in the global energy mix, delivering an affordable, versatile and sustainable fuel," IGU President David Carroll said in a news release. "In addition, the IGU fully supports urgent and increased efforts toward climate change mitigation. We strongly believe natural gas is perfectly positioned to make a significant positive impact to air quality while reducing carbon emissions."

The IGU recently published a series of case studies highlighting natural gas' role in clean energy in areas such as renewable generation, integrated distribution systems, biogas and power to gas. The report, "Case Studies Enabling Clean Energies," is available on IGU's website.

Go Fish – Natural gas pipe is being reused as fish habitat A project using expired natural gas pipe to help restore fish habitats in Kentucky is going along swimmingly, thanks to a partnership between Columbia Gas of Kentucky and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

Some of the utility's employees who are avid fishers and hunters learned about the need, and the utility saw getting involved as a way to connect with those interests while promoting its own sustainability efforts.

"Columbia Gas is always looking for ways to be better stewards of our financial and environmental resources. We are pleased to have found this opportunity to recycle and repurpose scraps from our infrastructure projects, keeping our pipe out of landfills and using it in a way that will positively impact wildlife for years to come", Columbia Gas of Kentucky President Herb Miller told American Gas.

Tree stumps and other structures made with pipe have been submerged into Cave Run, a large lake in Daniel Boone National Forest, to create habitat for fish to find food. Natural gas pipes work well because they are durable and don't rust. Other utilities donating to the project include Atmos Energy, Louisville Gas and Electric, and Vectren. *American Gas, February 2018*

The Department of Energy's Vehicle Technologies Office is looking for projects that will address barriers to adopting natural gas vehicles. The U.S. Department of Energy will award up to \$4 million for research projects on medium- and heavy-duty natural gas engine technologies. Selected projects will supplement the early-stage research on medium- and heavy-duty engine technologies that is occurring at Department of Energy national laboratories. The end goal is to expedite natural gas engines that are as efficienct as diesel engines while still achieving emissions standards. American Gas, February 2018
